How Rotarians Can Help Eradicate Disability From Clubfoot Birth Defect

Clubfoot occurs when a baby's tendons are shorter than usual, positioning the foot at a sharp angle to the ankle, like the head of a golf club. Because 80 percent of the 200,000 children born with clubfoot each year are in low or middle income countries, many do not receive treatment, resulting in a disability that affects their mobility and quality of life. ATM Services

Pavilhão de Exposições: At the main entrance of the Exhibition Pavilion there are ATM terminals for Banco Santander, Bank of Brazil, and Caixa Economica Federal. Additional ATMs are available within the Banco do Brasil bank location.

Palácio das Convenções: Two ATM terminals for Caixa Economica Federal are available across from the Audotorium Celso Furtado.

In both the departures and the arrivals areas at the airport, there are currency exchanges that are open 24 hours a day. The airport also contains banking facilities and several ATMs.

Foreign currencies can be exchanged on-site at a booth during the convention.

Many hotels also provide currency exchange services, but their rates are poor.

Attire

Business casual, as is customary in your country, is suitable for most events. Invitation-only events may require more formal dress.

Rented wheelchairs and scooters are for use only on Anhembi property and cannot be transported via the convention transportation shuttle system. Scooters and wheelchairs must be returned daily prior to the closing of convention registration.

Rental Fees (CASH ONLY: Brazilian Reals) Scooters: R\$100 per day Wheelchairs: R\$25 per day

To ensure availability of wheelchairs or scooters on a daily basis, renters can prepay for the specific number of days needed.

Renters bear all responsibility and liability for personal injury or damage to equipment. Renter shall be charged for any costs for equipment repair.

Registrants who require reasonable accommodations for their physical needs were asked to indicate their requirements when they registered for the convention. If your physical needs have changed since you registered, please visit the Convention Office (Pavilhão de Exposições, Anhembi).

Plenary Session Seating

Plenary sessions will be held in the pavilion at Parque Anhembi. Seating and access to all plenary sessions are first come, first served, except in designated reserved seating areas. A complete reserved seating list can be found on the convention mobile app.

During plenary session 4 only, seating will also be reserved for voting delegates duly certified by the Credentials Committee. Sergeants-at-arms are able to assist with locating a reserved seating section.

Policies

Code of Conduct

Rotary International is committed to maintaining an environment that promotes courtesy, dignity, and respect. The spirit of collegiality brings out the best in us, which contributes directly to our overall success. Attendees, volunteers, exhibitors, vendors, and RI staff are expected to conduct themselves in a professional and cooperative manner.

All attendees, including minors and Rotary employees supporting the convention, have the right to an environment free of:

- Inappropriate physical contact (including shoving or striking another person with the intent to threaten, intimidate, or harm)
- Unwelcome comments or jokes that threaten, degrade, or belittle
- Unwelcome advances (including suggestive comments, gestures, innuendos, and contact)

Rotary International takes allegations of code-of-conduct violations seriously. Those who believe their rights have been violated are strongly encouraged to report the incidents to the Convention Office. Code-of-conduct violations may result in revocation of an attendee's registration credentials, confiscation of any individual's, exhibitor's, vendor's or company's badges or access credentials, the removal of an individual, exhibitor, entity, or company from the buildings or grounds of Anhembi, Colégio, Novotel, and the Holiday Inn and forbidding entrance to the buildings or grounds of Anhembi, Colégio, Novotel, and the Holiday Inn to an individual, exhibitor, entity, or company without any refund of registration and/or application or other fees, as well as prohibition of attendance and/or exhibition at future RI conventions.

Special care must also be taken to ensure the safest possible environment for all young people attending the convention or convention-related activities. Rotary's Statement of Conduct for Working With Youth affirms that that "Rotary International strives to create and maintain a safe environment for all youth who participate in Rotary activities. To the best of their ability, Rotarians, Rotarians' spouses, and partners, and other volunteers must safeguard the children and young people they come into contact with and protect them from physical, sexual, and emotional abuse." Any allegations of abuse or harassment of youth will be reported to law enforcement and handled according to all applicable RI policies.

Fundraising

The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International is the only entity allowed to fundraise at the convention.

Music

Because of copyright laws, RI is unable to release or make available any of the music used during the plenary sessions.

Photography and Video Recording

Attendees and exhibitors are advised that while attending the Rotary International Convention, they may be photographed by any means, including still photography and video recording, and by attending the Rotary International Convention attendees and exhibitors grant Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation the perpetual, irrevocable, royalty-free right to use and publish and license use of their names, voices, statements, and likenesses for any purpose worldwide without Rotary International or The Rotary Foundation incurring debts or liabilities of any kind.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited at the convention.

Registration Information

You will receive the following items in the Registration Area (Pavilhão de Exposições, Anhembi):

- Your name badge (programmed to include any tickets purchased to Rotary-ticketed events)
- Program book
- Transportation guide and venue map

Registration Badges

All participants will be issued a name badge and are required to wear it at all times while at Anhembi. Your badge will be scanned at entrances to plenary sessions and Rotary events.

Rotary International complies with international data privacy standards to ensure that sensitive and confidential information is safeguarded. Name badges do not contain or provide access to sensitive or confidential information.

For security purposes, all registrants must present photo identification (driver's license or passport) to obtain their convention badges. RI reserves the right to check photo identification at any time during registrants' attendance at the convention. Spot checks will be made in order to compare badge information with photo identification. Badges that do not match photo identification will be confiscated without refund, and violators will be ejected. RI reserves the right to inspect all purses and bags. Registrants may refuse inspection; however, RI reserves the right to prevent entry to Anhembi and the Holiday Inn.

Itinerary Lookup Stations

Are you not sure if you purchased a ticket to a particular Rotary event? You can check your list of events at one of the self-service itinerary stations in the Registration Area. It's a simple one-step process: scan your name badge and see your information, including any preconvention or Rotary-ticketed events you have purchased. If you want to print a copy, just click the print button.

Note: Name badges do not include host events and tours, which are handled separately at the Host Event Ticket Sales booth.

On-Site Ticket Sales

If you did not purchase tickets in advance and would like to check availability, visit the following booths, all in Pavilhão de Exposições, Anhembi.

Rotary-ticketed events: If tickets are available, convention registrants must present their badges in

order to load the ticket to the badge electronically. No paper tickets are issued for these events. Tickets for RI meal events may become available at the last minute if other registrants cancel; these tickets will be sold at the RI Ticket Sales booth about one hour before the event. There will be no ticket sales at the door.

RI luncheon ticket exchange: If RI luncheon ticket holders are unable to attend their event, Rotary will facilitate exchanges between registrants at the Badge Correction booth (Pavilhão de Exposições, Anhembi). Both parties must be present with their badges at the time of the exchange, and any financial transactions must be conducted exclusively between the registrants.

Host-ticketed events: Convention registrants may purchase tickets, if available, from the Host Event Ticket Sales booth. This year's host events include:

- Carnival Parade
- Concert with Conductor João Carlos Martins and Samba School Vai-Vai
- Rotary Restaurant Nights (not ticketed)

Safety and Security

São Paulo welcomes visitors from around the world. But even the most experienced traveler knows that, regardless of location, tourists should exercise caution:

- Remove your convention badge and place it in a secure pocket or bag when you leave the convention venue. Wearing your badge in public can make you a target for pickpockets. If you are using the Rotary shuttle bus, keep your badge within easy reach to show it when boarding.
- Stay alert. Show strong, confident body language and make eye contact.
- Don't openly use cell phones, tablets, laptops, or other electronic devices. Not only can they distract you, they can be especially attractive to thieves.
- Carry only what you need. Limit the valuables you carry and avoid carrying large amounts of currency. Do not carry all of your key identification (including credit cards, Social Security card, and passport) at the same time or in the same wallet or purse.
- Keep your wallet or purse in a hard-to-reach place. Men should carry their wallets in a front pants pocket or inside suit pocket. Women should bury their wallets deep inside their purses and wear or hold their purses in front, covered with their hands.

- Be aware of your surroundings and exercise caution near banks, ATMs, and train and bus stations.
- Leave your Rotary bags in your hotel room and use a nondescript bag during your stay.

First Aid and Emergencies

During convention hours, emergency medical technicians are available at the First Aid Office (Pavilhão de Exposições, Anhembi). If you need medical attention, report to this location.

If you need immediate medical assistance and cannot get to the First Aid Office, contact any of the following people:

- Sergeants-at-arms (identified by a green vest or red sash)
- Venue security staff member
- Rotary staff member (identified by a red badge ribbon or a blue Rotary staff shirt)

For medical, safety, and security emergencies, or police assistance, call 192. Be prepared to identify your location.

Medical Centers and Hospitals
